Introduction

Dulverton Angling Association (DAA) is a locally based organisation developed over the last 4 years and is committed to providing access to local waters for the community. It currently has a membership of over 200 members from both locals and visitors.

The DAA provides fly-fishing for wild brown trout, grayling and salmon.

Membership

Membership is by written application to the Association.

The 2007 rates are:

Adults over 16	£25.00
Juniors 16 or under	£ 1.00

Membership is open to all. Membership application forms can be obtained from Pat Veale at Lance Nicholson in Dulverton. This payment entitles the member access to the DAA waters subject to booking arrangements which are detailed below. The Salmon beats are booked through the "Fish the Exe scheme

Beats and Bookings

The DAA has fishing rights over 4 beats covering about 5 miles. These beats are on the Little Exe and the Hadeo. Both these rivers carry only wild fish. Access to these waters is 7 days a week during the season.

The salmon beats are on the main Exe/Barle .Details can be obtained from Lance Nicholson or from the "Fish the Exe " website.

All beats are subject to booking and in the case of DAA waters cannot be prebooked more than 2 weeks in advance.

Fishing Guidelines

All members will require the appropriate Environment Agency fishing license and will be issued with a membership card. These should be available at all times as the may be subject to check.

A catch and release policy is generally applied. Rules applying to Salmon fishing should be checked on booking. Members are expected to observe the country code.

Environment

The DAA seeks to improve the conditions for its members. It works closely with the relevant agencies/owners to improve the rivers in its area. We organise our own working parties and have recently completed a detailed environmental survey for the South West Rivers Trust. This survey is part of the Exe River project, which seeks to improve the condition of the Little Exe on its journey from Exmoor to the Exe. All members are encouraged to assist in these activities.
